

Physical Description:

Single-story, 4 x 4 bay, stucco-clad, wood-frame Craftsman residence. Wood-shingled hip roof with boxed eaves. Interior brick chimney. Concrete foundation.

Primary entry contained within gabled foyer with gable pediment. Sunroom extends from the side (E) facade. Sunroom windows are all 1/1 double-hung with wood sashes. The windows of the main (N) facade are all multi-light wood casement type. Shallow bay window on side (W) facade. The basement has three-light wood casement type windows.

The site is slightly raised from that of the street.

Associated structure: Detached single-bay wood-frame garage is situated on the S.W. corner of the lot. It faces west with access via service alley. Asphalt-shingled gable roof with exposed rafters in open eaves (N & S). Drop siding. C. 1960 rolling wooden door. This structure does not appear on any of the Sanborn Maps, so presumably was built sometime after 1939. It would not therefore contribute to the proposed historic district. It should however be reconsidered at a future date.

Historical Information:

The earliest water and sewer records indicate that this house was built in 1921 and was originally owned by Charles C. Harper. Since Mr. Harper was a professional builder and contractor it seems highly probable that he was primarily responsible for its construction. The property was sold to Thomas Callahan in 1922.

According to the 1929 Polk Directory this house was still owned and lived in by Thomas F. and Lydia Callahan. At that time Mr. Callahan was the train master for the Havre Division of the Great Northern Railway.

Integrity:

Good. This building appears to have survived unchanged from the time it was originally constructed. It retains its original configuration (hipped roof, surroom), historic fabric (stucco exterior walls and wood-shingled roof) and distinctive stylistic features (foyer with gable pediment, fenestration).

Significance:

This structure retains its architectural integrity and historic character and would qualify for the National Register under criteria C and would contribute to the proposed historic

district. It is also a fine example of the work performed by an important local builder, Charles C. Harper.



Physical Description:

Single-story, 4 x 2 bay, wood-framed, Neo-Colonial Revival residence. Gable roof over irregular plan. Interior brick chimney. Wood shingle roof. Aluminum siding. Concrete foundation.

Left of center primary entry is contained within gabled foyer and features a Neo-Colonial Revival door surround with fluted pilasters. Entry access is via a flight of concrete steps. East facade has secondary entry.

Most windows are 6/1 double-hung with wood sash and sill. Some of which are paired. Main (N) facade includes a large picture window just east of the main entry. The side (W) facade has a bay window with large plate glass window.



Roll #29 Frame #8A

Associated structure: Detached single-bay wood-frame garage, similar in construction and styling to main house. This building seems to be contemporary to that of the main house. Both buildings, however, are less than fifty years old. They retain their architectural integrity and would contribute to the proposed historic district when in fact they become eligible.

Historical Information:

According to the earliest water and sewer records this house was constructed in 1941 and originally owned by Christ Fuglevand. Since Mr. Fuglevand was a professional contractor and builder it seems highly probable that he built this house.

Integrity:

Good. Although re-sided with aluminum this house retains its original configuration, some of its historic fabric (wood shingle roof) and several stylistic features and details (Neo-Colonial Revival wooden door surround, bay window).

Significance:

This building was constructed less than fifty years ago, but retains its architectural integrity and historic character and is a good local example of a Neo-Colonial Revival residence popular in the 1940s. It would qualify, when eligible, for the National Register under criteria C and would contribute to the proposed historic district.





Physical Description:

Single-story, wood-frame Craftsman duplex. Hip roof over symmetrical plan. Asphalt shingle (originally wood shingled up until at least 1939) roof. Two interior brick chimneys. Stucco exterior. Concrete foundation. Daylit basement.

The two main entries are symmetrically placed on either end of the main (S) facade. Each entry is sheltered by a gabled portico with round-arched entry opening. Entries are accessed via a small flight of wooden stairs flanked by stuccoed sidewalls.

Windows are either 6/1 or 6/6 double-hung with wood sash and sill. Most are either doubled or tripled. False aluminum shutters have been added recently (c.1960). Eyebrow dormer window centrally located on the main facade.

Historical Information:

Building Permit No. 1380 was issued to John A. McCauley on October 16, 1929. It also indicates that Christ Fuglevand was the builder. The original cost was \$5500. John A. McCauley was a professional plumber in Havre.





Physical Description:

Oriented to the south this L-shaped one-and-a-half-story Craftsman house has a main block with gable ridge parallel to the street and an ell with a double pitch roof and an attached garage on the west elevation. The walls are stucco with wood trim. The roof is asphalt shingle with baubles at the end of the ridge. Cement foundation. Endwall chimney on the south end of the side (E) elevation.

The windows are six-over-one double-hung wood sash. The main entrance is a modern door with an aluminum storm door. Cement stairs lead to the cement landing of the front door. Wrought iron handrails flank the landing. A round arch vent is located in the front (south) gable apex.

There is an attached garage with a corrugated fiberglass roll-up door located on the west elevation with the door opening to the south.

The site is level with that of the street.

Historical Information

According to a privately published history sponsored by the church and entitled Sixth Avenue Christian Church; 70th Anniversary - 1917-1987 a parsonage was dedicated in 1935. It originally occupied the site on the S.W. corner of Sixth Avenue and Sixth Street. In that year a new minister, A.R.H. Miller, had arrived and because of the housing shortage within Havre, the church's board decided to build a new home. When plans were made to expand the church in 1955 and to use that site for the construction of a new auditorium, the parsonage was moved to its present location, 527 Sixth Street. In 1974 a new parsonage was purchased on 2 Lila Drive and this building was sold. It is now a private single-family home.



Physical Description:

Single-story, 3 x 2 bay, stucco-clad, wood-frame Craftsman residence. Asphalt-shingled hip roof with boxed eaves. Two brick interior chimneys; one - interior, one - endwall on side (W) facade. Concrete foundation.

The windows have all been modernized and replaced with swinging wood casement type.

The site is bermed up slightly from that of the street.

Associated structure: (516 1/2 Sixth Street) Detached singlestory, 6 x 1 bay, wood-frame residence is situated on the S.W. corner of the lot. It faces north with access to Sixth Street via a winding concrete entry path. According to Building Permit No. 2077, dated 1946, this building was constructed for a total cost of \$1000.00. The name of the builder is not filled in, but since Mr. Gilmore was the manager of a lumberyard, it seems very probable he was the principle contractor for its construction. The structure was built too recently to qualify for the National Register and would not therefore contribute to the proposed historic district.

Historical Information:

According to the earliest sewer record this building was constructed in 1921 and was originally owned by Henry M. Gilmore. According to Building Permit No. 1105, dated 1927, a breakfast room was added.

The 1929 Polk Directory lists the 516 Sixth Street address and mentions that it was vacant. This indicates that the property originally functioned as a rental unit. Henry Gilmore, the owner-builder of the property – was the manager of the St. Anthony-Dakota Lumber Co. in Havre.

Fair. This building retains its original configuration and massing and some historic fabric (exterior stucco walls). It has however lost some of its architectural integrity because of the alterations of all the major windows and the modern glass enclosure of the main entry.

Significance:

This building retains enough of its architectural integrity and historic character to qualify for the National Register under criteria C as a contributing component within the proposed historic district. The separate "Mother-In-Law" on the ear of the property survives unchanged but was built too recently to qualify for National Register status.



Physical Description:

Single-story, 3 x 3 bay, wood-frame residence. Asphalt-shingled (originally wood shingled up until at least 1939) multiple clipped-gable roof. Two brick chimneys; one - interior, one - endwall on the side (W) facade (added after 1939).

Primary entry sheltered by portico with fluted Doric Columns. The windows vary considerably; they include 3/1 double-hung windows with wood sash and large picture windows.

The site is slightly bermed up from that of the street. Concrete

running strips run from Sixth Street and past the west side of the main structure. The property no longer contains a detached garage.

Historical Information:

According to the original building permit this building was originally owned and constructed by Henry M. Gilmore. Mr. Gilmore was the manager of the St. Anthony and Dakota Lumber Company in Havre and lived in this residence. He also built the two buildings directly to the east (516 and 516 1/2 Sixth Street) as rental units.





Physical Description:

Two-story-plus-basement, 5 x 7 bay, brick-faced, steel-framed schoolhouse. Flat composition roof over T-shaped plan. Raised concrete foundation with full daylit basement.

Multi-paned steel casement windows grouped in pairs, threes and fours. Central primary entry contained within shallow brick

foyer. The entryway is flanked by lights and decorative brickwork. The entry is approached via concrete steps flanked by curving concrete sidewalls. Decorative brickwork along the soldier-coursed brick cornice.

Originally the front pavilion housed classrooms, while the ell contained a gymnasium and stage. Today the classrooms have been converted into offices and the gym is used for the storage of supplies. Each corner of the ell has been added onto in order to provide shelter for school-owned vehicles.

Historical Information:

The building was originally built in 1936 as part of a county-wide Works Progress Administration construction and public improvements program. It originally served as Havre's Junior High School.

In 1960 the gymnasium was converted into additional classrooms. From 1964-73 the building housed the six grade class. In 1975 the building was officially dubbed the "Robins School" in honor of Stan Robins, a long-standing school-board member.

Today the building serves as the administrative headquarters for the school district, storage for school supplies and garages the vehicles used in maintenance.

Although the interior of building's gym has been renovated and additions have been constructed within the corners of the ells, this building retains its original presentation to the street, most of its historic fabric (exterior brick walls) and stylistic details (decorative brick work along the cornice and flanking the main entry).

Significance:

This building is significant as an example of the federal government's effort to rebuild the country during the Depression with one of many programs and would qualify for the National Register under criteria A (politics/government). It is also a significant local example of a the general aesthetic then prevalent with government buildings with its simplified Moderne styling and would also qualify for the National Register under criteria C.





The earliest water record indicates that this house was built in 1925 and originally owned by Adolph Pepin. In 1929 Adolph and

Katherine Pepin lived at 604 Fifth Avenue, directly to the east of this residence. It seems quite probable that Mr. Pepin lived on Fifth Avenue when his structure was first built in 1925 and that he developed this house either as a rental or for speculation. By 1929 this house was owned and lived in by Adlor and Mathilda Chevalier. According to the 1939 Sanborn Map this structure was partially used a retail grocery store.





Historical Information:

The earliest water and sewer records indicate that this house was built in 1915 and originally owned by Nick Faber. Nick Faber was an early-day cattle rancher in the Bear Paw Mountains and built two houses on Sixth Street as rentals (this one and the one directly to the west, 406 Sixth Street) and one on Fourth Avenue for him and his family (603 Fourth Avenue).

This house was converted into two separate residences sometime between 1920 and 1939. In 1929 this address was listed in the 1929 Polk as vacant. It is now a single-family residence again.



Building Permit No. 3135, dated March 24, 1948, indicates that an addition was constructed by Gordon Thompson for the total cost of \$1400.00. The owner at that point was Martin D'Neill.

The earliest water record indicates that this duplex was constructed in 1944 and originally owned by Christ Fuglevand. Since Mr. Fuglevand was a professional builder and contractor it seems highly likely that he constructed this building as well as owned it.

This structure retains its original configuration and symmetrical plan typical of a duplex, its historic fabric (clapboard siding) and styling details (plain wood brackets and exposed rafters along the eaves, entry porches with match-board sidewalls) all indicative of the Craftsman style.

Significance:

Because this building was constructed so recently it would not qualify for the National Register and would not contribute to the proposed historic district. It should however be reconsidered in the future.
